



MACAU SECURITY ANALYSIS REPORT

AI-Assisted Open Source Intelligence Assessment

Analysis Period: April 22, 2026 - April 29, 2026

This report was produced using open-source intelligence analysis. The assessment is grounded in publicly available reporting and should be cross-referenced with primary sources. RSS feed articles are listed in the annex for reference.

Executive Summary

During the period of April 22-29, 2026, Macau's security landscape was primarily characterized by enhanced border security measures, proactive cybersecurity defenses, and significant diplomatic engagement. Authorities tightened entry controls, denying over 2,500 mainland Chinese passport holders entry due to transit scheme abuse, and prepared for a massive influx of visitors for the upcoming Labour Day holiday with extensive crowd control. The government's cloud computing center demonstrated robust resilience against millions of monthly cyberattacks, while the Macao Judiciary Police actively participated in a regional counter-terrorism exercise. Concurrently, Macau's Chief Executive concluded a strategic European tour, aiming to bolster economic ties and promote the "One Country, Two Systems" principle, underscoring Macau's evolving geopolitical role.

Key Security Developments

- **Border Security Tightened Against Transit Scheme Abuse**

Macau authorities denied entry to more than 2,500 mainland Chinese passport holders between January and April 20, 2026. This action was taken due to suspected abuse of the city's transit entry arrangement, where individuals allegedly failed to present valid onward travel documents or made frequent entries to circumvent stay regulations. The Public Security Police Force has tightened enforcement, including reducing permitted stay durations for repeat offenders and denying entry after multiple violations, in coordination with mainland authorities.

- **Preparations for Labour Day Holiday Security**

The Public Security Police (PSP) forecast between 3.6 and 3.7 million border crossings for the five-day Labour Day holiday, running from May 1-5, 2026. In anticipation of this high volume, authorities announced plans to dynamically adjust resources at Macau's nine border checkpoints, open additional inspection lanes, and implement crowd-diversion measures. Joint inspections at the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge checkpoint and enhanced monitoring of cross-border vehicles are also being deployed.

- **Robust Cybersecurity Defenses Against Millions of Attacks**

Macau's government cloud computing center successfully repels, on average, more than four million cyberattacks every month. Despite this high volume of attempted intrusions throughout 2025, the Public Administration and Civil Service Bureau (SAFP)

confirmed that no security incidents have occurred to date, attributing this to a dedicated monitoring team and a rigorous security management regime.

- Participation in Regional Counter-Terrorism Exercise "STEALTHNET"

On April 16, 2026, the Macao Judiciary Police participated in the "Counter Cyber & Physical Terrorism Joint Exercise 2026," codenamed "STEALTHNET," coordinated by the Hong Kong Police Force. The exercise simulated complex hybrid terrorist threats, including cyber and physical attacks against financial, aviation, and healthcare systems across Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, and South Korea, as well as scenarios involving explosive devices and drones.

- Ongoing Implementation of New National Security Law

A new national security law, passed on March 19, 2026, allows judges to hear national security cases behind closed doors and requires defense lawyers to obtain clearances. This legislation, which buttresses Macau's Committee for Safeguarding National Security, aims to strengthen the framework for national security. Human Rights Watch has expressed concerns that the law could be open to potential misuse by the government and undermine the rule of law.

- Launch of 2026 National Security Education Series

The Macau SAR Government and the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in Macau jointly launched the 2026 Macau SAR National Security Education series on April 15, 2026. Chief Executive Sam Hou Fai emphasized that the SAR government will integrate national security requirements throughout all areas and stages of Macau's development strategy, aligning with China's 15th Five-Year Plan.

- Chief Executive Concludes Strategic European Diplomatic Tour

Macau Chief Executive Sam Hou Fai concluded a nine-day, four-nation European working tour to Portugal, Spain, Switzerland, and Belgium on April 26, 2026. The tour aimed to promote the "One Country, Two Systems" principle, expand economic cooperation with Spanish-speaking markets and the EU, and strengthen Macau's international profile.

- Significant Diplomatic and Economic Agreements Signed

During Chief Executive Sam Hou Fai's European tour, a total of 61 agreements were signed in Portugal and 48 in Spain. These agreements cover diverse sectors such as trade, technology, tourism, and education, highlighting Macau's efforts to diversify its economy and strengthen international partnerships.

- Decline in Overall Crime Rates for 2025

Macau recorded a 5.9% decline in criminal investigations in 2025, with a total of 13,458 criminal cases opened. The Office of the Secretary for Security reported decreases in serious violent crime, fraud, and cyber-related offenses, indicating a

stable and generally positive public security environment.

Geopolitical Impact and Regional Dynamics

Macau's recent security and diplomatic activities underscore its unique position as a Special Administrative Region (SAR) within China, operating under the "One Country, Two Systems" framework. The Chief Executive's extensive European tour, which concluded on April 26, 2026, aimed to promote this principle and expand economic cooperation with the EU and Spanish-speaking countries. This initiative highlights Macau's strategic role as a "bridge" or "platform" for China's engagement with Portuguese- and Spanish-speaking nations, a role actively emphasized by both Macau and mainland Chinese officials. The signing of numerous agreements in Portugal and Spain demonstrates a concerted effort to diversify Macau's economy beyond gaming and integrate it more deeply into global trade and cultural exchanges.

Regionally, Macau's participation in the "STEALTHNET" counter-terrorism exercise with Hong Kong, Singapore, and South Korea on April 16, 2026, signifies a commitment to enhancing cross-border security cooperation against evolving hybrid threats, including cyber and physical attacks on critical infrastructure. This collaboration reflects a broader regional effort to bolster collective security capabilities in a complex threat environment. Furthermore, Macau's ongoing alignment with China's 15th Five-Year Plan (2026-2030) and the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau Greater Bay Area (GBA) initiative is a central theme, emphasizing economic diversification and deeper integration into national development. This integration is designed to leverage Macau's unique advantages while contributing to China's overall modernization drive.

The implementation of Macau's new national security law, passed on March 19, 2026, allowing closed-door trials and requiring lawyer clearances, has drawn international attention, with Human Rights Watch raising concerns about potential misuse and its impact on the rule of law. While the Macau government asserts these measures strengthen national security, they contribute to a broader narrative of tightening control within China's SARs, which could influence perceptions of Macau's autonomy and its relations with Western democracies. China's new regulation on countering foreign extraterritorial restrictive measures, issued on April 13, 2026, also presents a potential indirect geopolitical impact, as it authorizes countermeasures against foreign actions harming China's interests, which could extend to Macau-related decisions if they affect mainland China.

Military and Defense Analysis

Macau, as a Special Administrative Region of the People's Republic of China, does not possess its own independent military forces. Its defense and military affairs fall under the direct responsibility of the Central People's Government of China. Consequently, there were no specific reports during the April 22-29, 2026 period concerning Macau's force posture, modernization programs, defense spending trends, or capability developments.

Any military activities or defense-related strategic shifts impacting Macau would be part of broader People's Liberation Army (PLA) operations and policies within the South China Sea region or related to the Guangdong Military District. While one search result mentioned a Chinese destroyer and frigate entering waters southwest of the Penghu islands on April 27, 2026, this is a regional Chinese military activity and not directly indicative of Macau's defense posture. Macau's security focus remains predominantly on internal public order, border control, and cybersecurity, with the Macao Judiciary Police playing a role in regional counter-terrorism cooperation.

Outlook and Forecast

Short-term trends (1-3 months): In the immediate future, Macau will experience heightened border security operations as it manages the significant influx of visitors expected for the Labour Day holiday (May 1-5, 2026). The Public Security Police will continue to implement dynamic resource adjustments, additional inspection lanes, and crowd-diversion measures at key checkpoints like the Barrier Gate and the Hong Kong-Zhuhai-Macau Bridge. Following the Chief Executive's European tour, there will likely be a focus on implementing the numerous economic and cultural agreements signed, particularly those aimed at diversifying the economy and strengthening ties with Portuguese- and Spanish-speaking markets. The ongoing National Security Education series will continue to reinforce the integration of national security into public consciousness and government policy.

Critical flashpoints and risk areas: A primary risk area remains border control, particularly concerning the potential for misuse of transit schemes and the sheer volume of cross-border traffic during peak periods, which can strain resources and create vulnerabilities. While Macau's cybersecurity defenses are robust, the constant barrage of millions of monthly cyberattacks presents a persistent threat, requiring continuous vigilance and technological upgrades to prevent any successful breaches of critical government infrastructure. The implications of the new national security law, particularly regarding its application and potential impact on civil liberties and the legal profession, will remain a sensitive area, potentially attracting further international scrutiny.

Indicators to monitor: Key indicators to monitor include the effectiveness of border control measures during the Labour Day holiday, specifically the reported number of denied entries or incidents related to transit scheme abuse. Any public statements or reports regarding the implementation of the new national security law, particularly concerning specific cases or legal challenges, should be closely watched. Furthermore, the frequency and sophistication of cyberattacks targeting Macau's government and critical infrastructure, along with any reported successful breaches, will be crucial indicators of the evolving cyber threat landscape. Progress on the economic diversification initiatives stemming from the European diplomatic tour will also be important for Macau's long-term stability.

Strategic recommendations: Macau should continue to invest heavily in advanced border management technologies and inter-agency coordination with mainland Chinese authorities to efficiently manage high traffic volumes and counter illicit activities. Strengthening cybersecurity resilience through continuous threat intelligence sharing, regular vulnerability assessments, and public-private partnerships is paramount given the high volume of attacks. To mitigate international concerns regarding the national security law, transparent communication and clear guidelines on its application, particularly concerning legal processes and human rights, would be beneficial. Finally, leveraging the diplomatic successes of the European tour to foster genuine economic diversification and reduce reliance on single industries will contribute to Macau's long-term stability and security.
